





Status of Public Water Systems in Western North Carolina on October 2nd, 2024







Current

- City of Asheville Currently the North Fork WTP and the Mills River WTP (operating normally) are producing enough water to satisfy system demand.
- Town of Burnsville -The raw water intake structure located on the Cane River was severely damaged and it is estimated that it will take two (2) years to rebuild
- Town of Spruce Pine -The raw water intake structure located on the Toe River was severely damaged and it is estimated that it will take less than one year to rebuild. The Town has as second water source (Beaver Creek Reservoir) and intake that is fully functional.
- Chimney Rock Village -The storm caused significant damage including washed out roads and bridges resulting in damage to water mains and the distribution system. It is estimated that it may take 2-3 years to repair the road.


